**Marvin Dainoff will give his views on the origins of Human Factors Engineering (HFE), its growth, and where we need to go in the future.**

Human factors and ergonomics had its origins in the attempts to understand and redesign individual implements (controls, displays, tools) from a human-centered perspective. As the field matured, it became clear that the broader context within which such implements were used need to be included within the HFE purview. Looking at the future, in the post 9/11, post Katrina world, our insights and skills are badly needed as the inherent difficulties of supporting complex systems with the appropriate technologies emerge. If we, as HFE professionals, can figure out how to convince decision makers to utilize these insights and skills, our contributions to society will be incalculable.



**Marvin J. Dainoff** is Professor Emeritus of Psychology and Director, Center for Ergonomic Research, Miami University, Oxford Ohio, President of Marvin Dainoff Associates, Inc., Consultant in Workplace Ergonomics, and Chairman of 1<sup>st</sup> Principles, Inc., an investment software development company. He is President of the Human Factors and Ergonomics Society and a Director of the Board of Certification in Professional Ergonomics. Dainoff's areas of research and professional interests include laboratory research on ergonomics of the work environment; applications of ergonomics and cognitive work analysis to methods of information display and communication, practical implementation of ergonomic principles in the field; and communication of ergonomic principles to scientific peers, interested professionals, and the general public.

Marvin Dainoff is a Certificant, Board of Certification in Professional Ergonomics. In 1995, he was elected Fellow of the Human Factors and Ergonomics Society and in 2002, he was elected a Director of the Board of Certification in Professional Ergonomics. He received the 1992 award for Professional Accomplishment (Academic) from the Technical Societies Council of Cincinnati, an association of twenty-three different technical groups. Dainoff serves on the editorial board of the *International Journal of Human-Computer Interaction*, *Journal of Occupational Rehabilitation*, and *Theoretical Issues in Ergonomics*. He is Chair of the Ergonomics and Health Aspects of Work with Computers Program Board of HCI International 2007. He received his BA in 1961 and PhD in 1969 from the University of Rochester in experimental psychology. He served six years in the Navy as both enlisted and officer.

## ***Southern Ohio Chapter - 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary!!!***

Or the 41<sup>st</sup>?! We had targeted our celebration for 40 years after our first record of 1965 Chapter Officers. But we recently received more details of the Chapter's beginnings from its first President, **Ben Schohan**, who now resides in Westerville after retiring from Rockwell. Ben writes:

*"At the 1963 Human Factors Society Annual Meeting in Palo Alto CA, president-elect Julien Christensen asked me to take the lead in forming a chapter of the HFS to be active during his tenure as HFS president (1964-65). Preliminary discussions between Julien and myself resulted in plans for a Spring 1964 call for a meeting to ascertain interest in establishing a chapter. This meeting was held in May 1964 in Yellow Springs. Throughout that summer Ed Hertzberg, Anthony Debons and I met in Dayton on Saturdays to prepare documentation required in applying for a Southern Ohio Chapter which would include Dayton, Columbus, and Cincinnati. These meetings were held in Malcolm Ritchie's office in downtown Dayton. Inputs were solicited from prospective chapter members. The Chapter was founded in September 1964 and accepted by the Human Factors Society at its 1964 Annual Meeting.*

Details from the Directory's Chapter History show the Yellow Springs meeting taking place at the Antioch Inn with 59 folks attending. Schohan, Hertzberg and Debons also served as the Chapter's first officers: President, Secretary, and Treasurer, respectively. Additional details were provided by **Lew Hanes** who still consults with the electric power industry in knowledge management and virtual reality R&D. Lew was Chapter President ('69) and Treasurer ('67) and provided these memories:

*"I vaguely recall attending an Executive Council session associated with a national meeting of the Human Factors Society at which the request was made by the Southern Ohio group to become a Chapter of the Society. I expected that we would be called on by the Council to describe our group, but the session was running late and our application was accepted without discussion. (I should qualify this history in that I believe that the reason for attendance at the Council was to support the Chapter request, but it may have been to support a request to host the 1965 national Society meeting.)*

*We met every two or three months, with 12 to 20 people in attendance. Attendees were mainly from Dayton, Columbus, and a few from Cincinnati. We had good support from a few WPAFB HF engineers and related disciplines, consultants and contractors in the area, etc. At that time HF was expanding beyond military applications. The HFE function in NCR was growing rapidly and Richardson Smith (now Fitch) located in Columbus was a very successful industrial design company with strong interest in HF. There were employees from other companies that were active in the Chapter, also, but I do not recall their names. In retrospect, we had little if any student participation in the Chapter. I suppose that this was due to no HF program at University of Dayton, Wright State was just getting started, and we did not engage Ohio State students. We had a good group of people in the Chapter during the 60s, and I enjoyed the social contacts and professional discussions. I participate in the Central Ohio Chapter now that I live in Columbus.*

*Best wishes to all, Lew."*

We heard from two other founding members. **Melvin Rudoy** shared his recollection of all the 'big guns' in the chapter, including Walt Grether, Julien Christensen, and Mel Warrick. **Glenn Gallaway**, former Chapter Secretary ('71) and President ('81), shares that a lot of what he learned from colleagues in the SOH Chapter, along with University of Dayton classes and NCR work, has been invaluable to him throughout his career, including his current FAA work. He also recalls the members then, as now, being dedicated to holding the Chapter to a high level of professionalism while outreaching to the community to provide human factors support. Another founding member replied, "40 years? I remember the *FIRST* meeting! Certainly made ME feel OLD all of a sudden!" I won't mention this individual's name, so he can still pass as one of the Chapter's youthful members!

"Thanks for the memories"! Hearing from each of you makes this 40/41<sup>st</sup> Anniversary special!

He is internationally recognized for his contributions to the theory and applications of psychophysiological measures of operator state with a focus on applications to operational environments. **Laura Militello, President-Elect:** Laura is a Senior Research Psychologist at the University of Dayton Research Institute. Current research interests include team decision making and collaboration in the context of emergency response/crisis management; human factors applications in the design of medical devices and health care systems; as well as cognitive engineering methods.

**Kristen Liggett, Secretary-Elect:** Kristen is the Technical Advisor for the System Control Interfaces Branch, Warfighter Interfaces Division, Human Effectiveness Directorate, Air Force Research Laboratory. ### ***SOH Chapter Had Great Presence at 2005 Orlando National Meeting***

Over 46% of our Chapter members participated in some way at the recent National HFES Meeting! Of our 67 Chapter members, 25 attended and another 6 'remotely participated' as a co-author. [Figures drawn from program, pre-registration list, email, and visual detection – may have missed someone!] Of the 25 members attending, 11 were lead authors on papers or participated on panels/symposia. Another 4 attending were co-authors on 8 papers. Seven of the technical sessions were chaired by six of our members. At least five members were involved in a variety of Society committee meetings, and that doesn't take into account all the members that attended the Technical Group Business Meetings. Bottom line: it's questionable whether there was ever a single minute at the recent National HFES meeting in Orlando that a Chapter member wasn't participating in some fashion! ### ***National's "Local Chapter Distinguished Service Award"***

National has decided to start presenting this award at the 2006 Annual Meeting! Due to the short notice (submittals due 10 Dec 2005), it is not expected that any Chapter will be able to meet all four criteria. Rather, the Chapter best meeting the criteria will be awarded \$300 in San Francisco next year. Our Chapter will be submitting documentation on our service activity to foster human factors in our community (science fair judging and Human Factors Brochure) and our contribution to the 2005 Annual Meeting (2 of the 4 criteria). 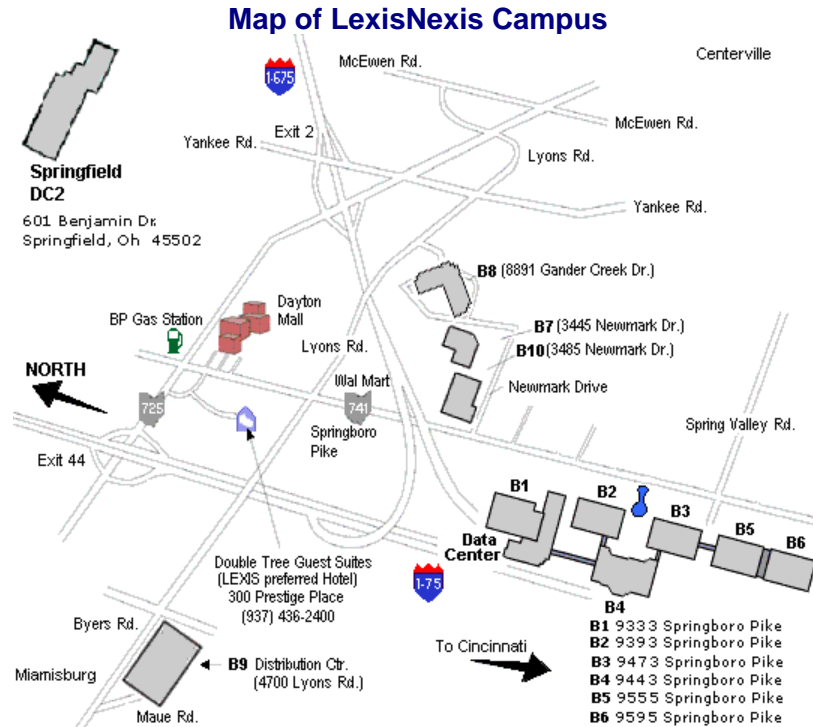
